The Commutative Property of Addition. The commutative property of addition reads as follows: The order of the addends does not change the result. That is, when you have to solve a sum, no matter the order in which you put their addends, you will always get the same result. Commutative Property of Addition: Definition. The commutative property of addition says that you can also add $2 + 1 + 3$ or $3 + 2 + 1$ and still get the same answer. Let's think about marbles for a minute. Let's say we have two groups of marbles. One group only has one marble and the other group has two marbles. Commutative property. The important thing to notice in the two examples above is that the order we do things can be switched, so it does not matter or will never cause any problems or conflicts.
