

Download How To Do Rise Over Run In Algebra

Slope is used very often in Mathematics. It can be used to actually find how steep a particular line is, or it can be used to show how much something has changed over time. We calculate slope by using the following definition. In Algebra, slope is defined as the rise over the run. This is written as a fraction like this: $\text{Slope} = \frac{\text{Rise}}{\text{Run}}$. "You have to RISE before you RUN" <http://www.screenr.com/iwI8> Finding the Slope of a Line from the Graph. Let's look at the line going through the points. The simplest way to look at the slope is. (rise over run) To get from the point (-2, -1) to the point (4, 3), you rise up 4... and run 6. The slope is. (Notice that the slope goes uphill and is a positive number) How to Find Rise Over Run First, look at a graph of a line and find two points, 1 and 2. You can use any two points on a line. The slope will be the same between any two points on a straight line. Note the X and Y value for each of the points.
