In the United States, coins are made by the United States Mint and paper money is made by the Bureau of Engraving and Printing. Both are part of the federal Department of the Treasury in the executive branch. The amount of money in circulation is regulated by the Federal Reserve, which orders new bills and coins and distributes them to banks. What branch of government can print money? The executive branch, through the US Treasury. The Bureau of Engraving and Printing prints paper money, while the US Mint makes coins. The government prints the money and it is owned by the government until it is in circulation in the markets. Once money reaches the market, it is owned by the person who has it in his possession. Only the federal government has the power to print money and control trade with other nations, and the power to provide for the country's defense.
